Policy Statement

REVISED DATE: September 22, 2021

To provide for the effective issuance, administration, and cancellation of accounts receivable.

<u>Policy</u>

 Where appropriate, Big Lakes County will extend credit to its customers and ratepayers. Depending on the nature of the transaction, the process for collections will be different; taxes, utilities, and general accounts receivable will be processed according to legislation and best practices, as identified in the procedure accompanying this policy.

Collections

- 2. The timely collection of amounts owing to the County facilitates the provision of services through predictable and stable cash flows.
- 3. The collection of taxes receivable will occur in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Government Act.
- 4. The collection of utilities receivable will occur in accordance with industry best practices. In the event of non-payment, utility services will be disconnected. Utility services will not be reconnected until such time as arrears and a reconnection fee are paid in full. Where applicable, uncollectable utility charges will be transferred to tax accounts and/or referred to collection agencies.
- The collection of miscellaneous accounts receivable will occur in accordance with industry best practices. Where applicable, uncollectable miscellaneous charges will be referred to collection agencies and/or pursued through legal action.

Write-offs

- 6. Council delegates Director of Corporate Services or the Chief Administrative Officer to authorize and to write off individual Accounts Receivable, and property taxes, that are less than \$500. A summary of all those accounts cancelled will be reported to Council.
- 7. Accounts Receivable write-offs and all property tax write-offs greater than \$500 require Council's authorization.
- 8. The write-off of any particular account receivable in no way prevents the eventual collection of that account.
