NOTICE OF SPRAY EXEMPTION

The Spray Exemption Policy has changed – a signature on the contract will only be required once. If previously enrolled, a new contract is not required for 2021. New program participant contracts must be signed and submitted before May 3rd. This signed contract will include participants on a permanent basis. Visit biglakescounty.ca for more details.

WILDFIRE SEASON

From March 1st to October 31st, a fire permit will be required for any type of burning in the Forest Protection Area. A campfire for cooking or warming does not require a fire permit. Have you burned this winter? Follow these tips to prevent wildfires this spring:

- 1. Spread remaining material within the pile and soak with water as required
- 2. Check the area and ensure both heat and smoke are no longer being produced by the pile
- 3. Check your burn site multiple times in the following weeks to ensure it has not reignited
- 4. Report your winter burn locations by calling 780-849-7457 **Visit biglakescounty.ca for more details.**

WATER TOKENS

Effective March 1, 2021, Big Lakes County will no longer be selling water tokens. Customers may use their debit card or credit card for transactions at each station or set up an account at the Big Lakes County office.

The truckfill stations will continue to accept water tokens after March 1st. The County will not deactivate the tokens for at least 6 months to a year to allow people to use up any tokens they may have stockpiled. If you happen to have tokens after we have deactivated the system, please visit the County office in High Prairie. If you have any more questions, please contact our office at 780-523-5955.



FREE INCOME TAX FILING SERVICE

FOR PEOPLE WITH A MODEST INCOME AND A SIMPLE TAX SITUATIONS
WITH CRA TRAINED VOLUNTEERS

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- Individual with annual income of \$35000 or less
- Family with combined income of \$45000 or less (add \$2500 for each dependent)
- Individual with less than \$1000 in investment income

WE CANNOT PREPARE TAX RETURNS FOR:

- Anyone with employment expenses, business or rental income/expenses
- Anyone who is self-employed
- Anyone who is deceased
- Anyone claiming capital gains or losses
- Anyone with major investments/RRSP/stocks/mutual funds/RESP
- Anyone who has filed bankruptcy

We are only able to serve residents of Big Lakes County and the Town of High Prairie.

Please bring valid photo ID and proof of residence to your appointment,
as well as all relevant tax slips.
