Animal Control

Cat Regulations

At the June 28, 2023 Council meeting, Council passed the new animal control bylaw that includes regulations on cats within the hamlets. If residents live within a hamlet, this new bylaw amendment has the following changes:

- Hamlet residents must license their cats with the animal control department. Please contact the animal control officer by visiting the Big Lakes County administration building in High Prairie or call 780-523-5955 to get more information.
- Hamlet residents are limited to owning 3 cats per residence.
- No hamlet cat-owner shall:
 - Allow their cats on any other property except their own
 - Have a cat remain in distress
 - Have their cat attack any person, chase other animals or cause any damage or nuisance off the cat-owner's property
 - Run at large off the owner's property
- Cats captured by Animal Control will be held for 72 hours in accordance with section 6.2 of this Bylaw before being transferred to an animal rescue, placed up for adoption, or euthanized.

The presented amendments provide Administration with the authority to enforce regulations in hamlets and provide education to residents for cat related issues. This may include issuing verbal warnings, issuing fines (\$100 for first offence, \$200 for the second and reoccurring offence), or capturing at large and nuisance cats.

Property Inspections

Compass Assessment Consultants Inc. will be conducting property inspections in selected areas (73-17, 74-16, 74-17, and 74-18) within the County starting on Monday, August 14, 2023, through to Friday, August 18, 2023, to conduct property re-inspections.

Property re-inspection is a standard policy put in place by the provincial government that requires all Alberta municipalities perform ongoing re-inspections and complete overall inspections of all properties in a five-year term.

County assessors will be wearing photo identification badges. If residents are not home, assessors will leave a door hangar with information to contact the Assessment department at 1-800-251-9711. If you have any questions, please contact our Taxation and Assessment Clerk at Big Lakes County at 780-523-5955.

All information collected during the re-inspection is subjected to the Freedom of Information and Privacy of Protection Act.
